e-LINK: FULL-TEXT FAST



Most of HSL's journals can be accessed online. *e-Link* provides direct links from a database citation to the full text of the article online (if available), and if the electronic full text is not available, *e-Link* checks CLIO, the library catalog, to see if Columbia has what you need in paper format. *e-Link* can also help you submit interlibrary loan requests. Just click on the *e-Link* icon while you are searching databases for a menu showing the available options.

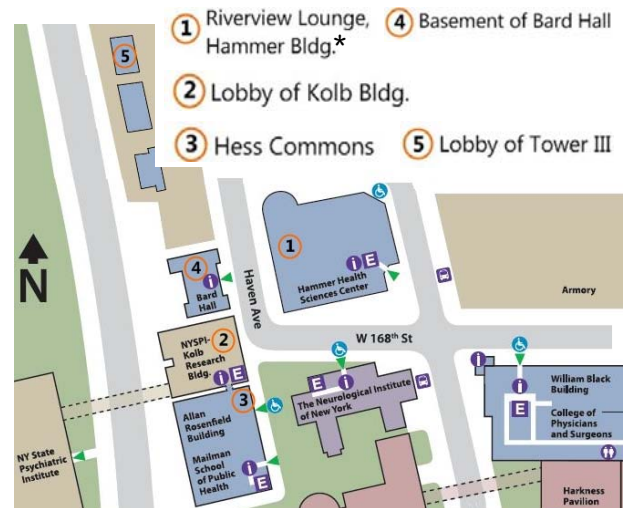

* NOTE: The Riverview Lounge (located on the 4th floor of the Hammer Building) will be available as a study space for approximately the first month of the Fall semester.

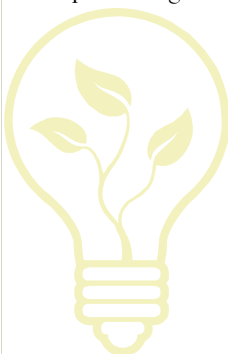




COLUMBIA’S GUIDE TO GREEN COMPUTING

Changes to networking equipment in the Georgian Building last month brought a roll out of the secure wireless network, Athens. You should now be able to connect to the Athens network anywhere in the building. If your computer isn’t already configured for wireless at CUMC please see <http://www.cumc.columbia.edu/it/wireless> - look for the link to your computer’s operating system under the Athens heading towards the bottom of the page. Guest-net is also available in Georgian, however it is not secure and will not let you view some Medical Center intranet sites such as <http://infonet.nyp.org>, or connect to secured or licensed resources.

The Bradford network access management tool was also set up to manage wired registration and help keep the network at Georgian more secure, however not all floors are currently being managed. We’ll continue to post signs and send out information about Bradford as it is implemented in more locations. We’d like to thank everyone who has helped make the process easier through complying with network security policies in advance by making sure their computers have fully updated operating systems as well as working anti-virus and antispyware programs. TAKE CONTROL OF YOUR COLUMBIA E-MAIL ACCOUNT

Wondering how to cut back on spam messages, or about forwarding Columbia emails to another account? There are many tools to help manage your email on the myUNI site: <http://uni.columbia.edu>

Select the link to **Login to Manage Your UNI Account** to login and view options including Changing your Password (this goes into effect instantly, be sure to use it if you’re concerned that someone may know your UNI’s password), Email Forwarding and Filters, Upgrade to an Extended Student Account and even Check Your Page Quota and Purchase Pages online with a credit card for your NINJa printing account.

Some of the links require that you log in again to Ingo, which manages the “scripts” or commands on the Columbia mail server for your account. If you haven’t used Ingo before, be sure to read the tutorial for Ingo Basics at:
